Caribbean Network of Fisherfolk Organisations (CNFO) partnered with Caribbean Natural Resources Institute on Capacity building in fisheries evidence, networks, and management (Virgin Islands) project. The project is implemented by the Centre for Environment, Fisheries and Aquaculture Science (Cefas), CANARI, and the Government of the Virgin Islands and funded by the Darwin Plus Overseas Territories Environment and Climate Fund. Four online sessions were held on the CNFO Leadership Institute.

HURRICANE PREPAREDNESS FOR CARIBBEAN FISHERFOLK



SECURE BOATS AND FISHING GEAR

- Remove boats to higher grounds. Turn them over, secure with rope or tie the boat. Boats can also be filled with sand and sunk for protection against high winds.
- Protect nets by weighing them and securing them where they will not be washed away by floodwaters.

CREATE EVACUATION PLAN

- Evacuate low-lying coastal areas.
- Do not go out to sea if storm threatens. The strength or speed could change unexpectedly.
- Make sure of an alternate safe route to the nearest shelter in your area.





SECURE IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS

- Gather all vital documents like boat registration, ID's including passport and put in a safe place.
- Take pictures of all fishing gear and equipment preferably with date and location stamps.
- · Take cash out of ATM and keep with you.

CREATE COMMUNICATION PLAN

- Ensure land to boat communication. Eg. VHF radio and cell, or satellite phone.
- Monitor weather on a radio, weather app or website of your choice.
