

# Conference of the Ocean People Defying Colonial Capitalism: Uniting for the Future of Earth & Oceans 8 June (Ocean Day) – 9 June 2025

The Second Conference of the Ocean Peoples (C-OP2) is a global political summit organised by the World Forum of Fisher Peoples (WFFP) on 8 and 9 June 2025, online.

Organised by and for fisher peoples from more than 50 countries, C-OP2 brought together over 300 participants, including Indigenous communities, coastal and inland fishers, seafood gatherers, fisherwomen's movements, UN rapporteurs, academics, and solidarity networks. Together, they exposed and resisted the ongoing assault on our waters, while asserting the demands and political vision of ocean peoples.

C-OP2 builds on the legacy of the first conference in 2022, which you can revisit at http://blueeconomytribunal.org/c-ophome. "Today, we renew that spirit with greater urgency—at a time when imperialism, authoritarianism, and militarised climate governance are accelerating violence, hunger, displacement, and ecological loss for our communities."

"Since the late 1970s, NFF has resisted destructive state policies that favour industrial and mechanized fishing."

"Comrades, our demand is clear. We want law, not welfare. We want justice, not charity. Fisher Rights legislation is the goal of NFF. We are training our youth and women leaders not only to resist destruction, but to imagine and lead an alternative future. One where the sea is not for sale. One where fishers are not prisoners of development. One where the coast belongs to the people who protect it."

#### **BELIZE**

#### Sea level rise and erosion in Punta Negra, Belize.

Erosion has been a persistent problem, intensifying over the last five years, and has impacted over 10 miles of coastline, reducing the beach by up to 60 feet in some areas.

#### About SSF Guidelines

#### **Participatory management**

Small-scale fishing communities can play an important role in managing, restoring, conserving, and protecting aquatic resources and ecosystems. States and government institutions can empower and support fishing communities to engage in such participatory management – also called comanagement – of fisheries resources together with government institutions and other groups.

#### CNFO & SSF Guidelines:

- Developing and implementing an advocacy campaign to address identified
  fisheries challenges in three CNFO member states, in the context of implementing
  the SSF Guidelines (Anguilla 8th, 10th, and 15th March 2022); (Jamaica 13th,

# Project Updates



January 9, 2024 **Tides** Foundation. the on recommendation of CSFund. gave the CNFO a grant of USD\$60,000.00. This grant is CNFO's for the Just The Transitions. arant period is from January 1, 2024, to December 31, 2026



Regional Advisory Groups (RAG) were created in 2020 to ensure a coherent implementation of policies, strategies and actions in support of the SSF Guidelines implementation at the regional level. The CNFO is a member of the Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) region.

#### **CANARI PROJECT**

Promoting the ecosystem approach to fisheries in Saint Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, and Trinidad and Tobago.

A Stewardship Action Learning Group (ALG) is to be established and facilitated through the CNFO's Leadership Institute.

There will be a fisher learning exchange in 2025 and another in 2026.

Caribbean Biodiversity Fund, co-financed by the International Climate Initiative (IKI) of the German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, Nuclear Safety and Consumer Protection through KfW.

#### Voluntary Guidelines for Securing Sustainable Small-Scale Fisheries

in the context of Food Security and Poverty Eradication

#### Value chains, postharvest and trade

Involve post-harvest actors in the decision-making process. Stress the role of women. Infrastructure and technology investments, value-added activities, and post-harvest loss and waste reduction.

#### GOVERNANCE OF TENURE

Secure equitable tenure rights to fishery resources and coastal land. Sustainable resource management including co-management.

## Social development, employment and decent work

Address issues such as education, health services, financial services, social protection, public infrastructure, and other public services.

Health and safety; measures to improve safety at sea.

### Gender equality

Improve gender equality in the entire value chain. Equal participation of women in decision-making, mainstreaming gender issues.

#### DISASTER RISK AND CLIMATE CHANGE

Develop policies, strategies for climate change adaptation and mitigation, and emergency response and disaster preparedness.





Strengthening the science-policy interface: sharing of knowledge and supporting policy reform


A strengthened knowledge base that informs a policy reform within a human rights context.

Effective participation and fair representation in governance and development. Capacity development (technical skills, organizations skills, business development)

Supporting implementation: program management, collaboration and management

Establishment of a transparent monitoring system and strengthened partnerships and collaboration.
