BELIZE FISHERMEN COOPERATIVE ASSOCIATION FEELING POSITIVE GOING INTO 2020 GILLNET FISHING CONTINUES

The BFCA was formed in 1970 and is a board member of the Caribbean Network of **Fisherfolk Organisations** (CNFO) who is a member of the World Forum of Fisher Peoples (WFFP). Big and powerful ENGO OCEANA formed a coalition with other like-minded partners in August 2018 with a mission to ban gillnet use in Belize. The BFCA was resolute that fisher's rights would not be trampled upon. OCEANA's ultimatum to government was that there should be a ban by the end of 2019 or the two-milliondollar financial aid package would disappear.



In December 2019, the government issued a press release highlighting new measures that would be deployed to phase out the use of gillnets gradually over a span of two years.

"The fixed date that is being demanded by environmental organizations before funds can be released to help the fishermen is arrogant, disingenuous and lacking in compassion and consideration for those who feed their families from this means" - *Hon. John Saldivar, Minister of National Security*
